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Annual Report (2020-21)

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE YEAR IN BRIEF

1. Starting from 2009 up to now 700 school dropout girls were oriented 260 were supported in our centres out of which 160 were mainstreamed with formal schools through the efforts of the centre and community level mobilization. The programme support of Centre for World Solidarity had culminated in the past year but the organization was able to sustain the efforts at the community level.
2. 600 early and forced marriages were stopped in time as a result of our extensive campaigns and ground level interventions against early and forced marriages in the year 2020-21. The programme had the support of CREA in the years 2019-20 and 2020-21.
3. 600 adolescent girls were supported and facilitated to establish themselves as Peer Leaders, Committee Leaders, Mohalla Leaders, Village Leaders and Sukanya Club Leaders in the year 2020-21. The programme was supported by various collaborating partners like CREA and PHIA Foundation in the year 2020-21. The programme was supported by PHIA Foundation.
4. From 2017 onwards the organization has been undertaking a targeted programme for nurturing Techno-Leaders in various Mohallas. FAT has been supporting our programme of Techno-Leaders. 60 girls were trained and capacitated as Techno-Leaders in various mohallas of Patna in the year 2020-21.
5. The follow up with digital literacy initiative of the organization continued in this year also. There are approximately 252000 young girls and women were provided digital knowledge and literacy by way of deploying 360 technical volunteers still active in the operational areas.
6. Under the initiative namely Swachh Bachpan Muskurata Bachpan, WASH awareness, training and infrastructure development was done in 80 schools and 40 Anganwaris. The programme was supported by PHIA Foundation. The programme had begun in the year 2018-19 and continued through 2020-21. In this year the programme assumed the shape of COVID 19 related sanitation and hygiene requirements and integrated the same in the project.
7. During COVID 19 Pandemic 525 families were provided dry rations and COVID Kits. Our previous collaboration partners such as **CREA and PHIA**

Foundation supported the efforts of the organization in this regard. We also received the support of Urgent Action Fund in this regard in the year 2020-21. Awareness building on COVID 19 and food, health, nutrition and livelihood service linkages was done among 30000 families with the deployment of 100 volunteers in 300 villages.

8. As a result of combined efforts of all the project level and community level workforce of the organization, approximately 170 cases on Violence Against Women were supported for resolving in the year 2020-21.
9. The programme started in 2010 continued through 2020-21 we had 60 Elected Women Representatives were trained on leadership, gender issues, visibility, good governance, planning and participation. The programme was supported by CREA.
10. The organization up to now have become instrumental in 1000 women getting trained and assisted to become established social leaders in 20 districts of Bihar and over 3500 Single Women organized and capacitated as State Wide Single Women's Network.
11. The organization continued its collaborated with State Government of Bihar in operating Children's Home of Bihar State Child Protection Society (SCPS Bihar) where 30 children for every year were sheltered and 20 were re-united with their families during 2020-21.

INTRODUCTION:

IZAD is a Secular, Non-Government, Voluntary Organization registered under Society Registration Act XXI, L860 Govt, of Bihar, Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) 1975, and Income Tax Exemption section 12 A. A socially devoted group of activists led the foundation of the Organization, to address the issues of the poorest of the poor and the ultra poor at rural as well as urban areas. The Organization aims "To work towards the upliftment and betterment of the deprived and the vulnerable sections of the society with special emphasis on Dalit and Minority Communities, to provide them with rights based opportunities and to bring them back into mainstream of the society". The organization believes and practices community based strategic planning, program monitoring and evaluation following participatory approach. Through communitization it tries to make community, local governance and government sensitive towards problems of ultra poor, dalit and minorities. It believes on blending professionalism with social feeling. It

emphasizes on optimum involvement of women members and has a gender policy accepted across programs.

The major activities of the organization are Dalit and Muslim women empowerment, education to child labour, poor, Dalit and Muslim children, empowerment of Dalit and Muslim adolescent girls , livelihood promotion to Dalit and Muslim women , gender sensitization, strengthening to EWR, youth skill development, domestic violence, women rights, health, hygiene and sanitation, sensitization on legal issues and human rights, sensitization to community on ICDS, various govt. schemes and programs etc.

TARGET GROUP:

Ultra poor with focus on Dalit, Adivasi and Marginalized community and children, adolescent girls and women, child labour , elected women representatives, youth, small and marginal farmers, disabled, Transpiration, weaker section of society etc.

THE MISSION:

To work towards the upliftment and betterment of deprived and vulnerable communities with special emphasis on Dalit and Mar children, adolescent girls and women, to provide them with rights based opportunities and to bring them back into mainstream of the society.

THE VISION:

IZAD believes that each and every person is equal and they have equal rights to live in this world with dignity. There should be no room for any discrimination whether it is in the form of gender, caste, religion or regional origin.

- To minimize gender inequity prevailing in the society.
- To organize and aware the rural community, strengthening community institutions and making Govt. sensitive towards the problems of rural poor and ultra poor .

- To work for strengthened and responsive local Self Governance.

ORGANIZATION PROGRAM 2020-2021

STRENGTHENING CIVIL SOCIETY INITIATIVE/PROGRAMME:

The programme is one of the core programmes of the organization. An empowered, active and well-informed civil society is a strategic intervention focus of the organization since its inception. The program focuses on strengthening the people by providing them education and skills so that they cope up with the fast-changing world and be able to avail the facilities provided by the government. Under this project we executed several programs and interventions intended to provide better facilities. They are:

- There is continued follow up with the Chirag Jivan Kaushal Sikshan Kendras which were operationalized in the past years among various communities to strengthen girls.
- From 2009 to till date approximately 5500 school dropout girls were oriented 4000 were supported in our centres out of which 3000 were mainstreamed with formal schools
- There are informal community centres operational among various communities. People are being constantly communicated with and meetings are being organised to operate the community centres in sustainable manner.

- In all the intervention areas of the organization whether projects are in operation or not regular meetings are being organised with peer group educators who have been nurtured through various organizational efforts.
- Support for the community to claim Aadhar Cards and if needed affidavits are also being supported for income certificate and caste certificate.
- Whether with support or not the organization has made it a practice to hold Art of living sessions regularly with the target group members.
- The organization engages regularly in promoting girls from vulnerable communities to get back to schools.
- We have dedicated to promoting computer education and technology access to girls in all the communities the organization works with.

FOOD SECURITY PROGRAMME:

From past many years the organization has adopted FOOD SECURITY as one of the major issues to be tackled. The organization acts upon Food Security with utmost commitment and continues to engage all possible stakeholders around this issue. Meetings of Anganbari Sevika, assistants, teachers, committee members, Aaprajita Committee members and ward members were conducted in the presence of women representatives on monthly basis to make sure that people of respective villages are getting food grains and oil as provisioned to them by the government. The meeting also checks if the children are getting proper meal at Anganbari Centers and primary schools as per the provisions of the government.

COVID-19 RESOPONSE PROGRAMME:

The people of Bihar State went through (and are still going through) very hard, stressed, helpless and uncertain times due to the huge spread of the Corona Virus Pandemic during the second wave of COVID 19 all over India. Bihar still continues to be one among the worst hit states in the second wave. The Bihar Government had extended the



lockdown through June 2021 and is expecting to have started the step-by-step unlock process from the second half of June 2021 which might continue through July 2021 since the situation is not yet under control. It is a relief to everyone that the rate of infections and loss of lives have very positively come down.

The entire areas of the organizational operations is in the marginalized communities. The daily wage earners mostly internal migrant labour families were hit very badly. After announcement of lockdown, these families have again become devoid of any livelihood to support them. Within a very few days it become tough for them to buy food and basic essentials for their family. Moreover, unemployment among the daily farm and non-farm labourers has also gone up.

With the dedicated efforts of the organization team during COVID 19 Pandemic 525 families were provided dry rations and COVID Kits. Our previous collaboration partners such as CREA and PHIA Foundation supported the efforts of the organization in this regard. We also received the support of Urgent Action Fund in this regard. Awareness building on COVID 19 and food, health, nutrition and livelihood service linkages was done among 30000 families with the deployment of 100 volunteers in 300 villages.

DIGITAL LITERACY AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION PROGRAMME FOR GIRLS:

As per UDISE, School Dropout rate in Bihar is 17.6% in 2020-21. Continuity of education for girls is decreasing in every next class, 0.5 lakh girls are dropped every year out of approx 2 crore registered students (as per Bihar Vidhan Sabha Proceeding). Digital education is a major concern with only 5.63% schools of Bihar has availability of computers. Further, only 58.63% schools have libraries in schools.



Digital education would equip the rural marginalized girls with the tools and techniques to equally and actively participate in solving the complex challenges our world faces. Thus, the girls would be able to participate in digital revolution and mitigate the digital divide.

The organization also focuses on identifying and removing the Social/Economic/Technological Barriers at local level to adopt the positive change. Advocacy at grassroots level for continuity of intervention for creative and scientific futuristic learning is given focus and priority so that girls would continue to lead a techno revolution.

PROGRAMME FOR STOPPING EARLY AND FORCED MARRIAGES:

The target communities we are working with are traditionally and custom pressured to marry off their young girl children before attaining the age for marriage. Our operational realms include preventive, curative and advocacy level interventions aimed at stopping early and



forced marriages. Due to the hard practical situations and the large amount of demanding dedicated efforts; there is hardly any organization in the proposed areas working on the issue of early and forced marriages especially among the Dalit, Muslim and other most vulnerable communities. The discussions on various child rights could be welcome by the community but when it comes to the issue of girl children's vulnerability to forced/early marriages; the community assumes deliberate silence. This is where the relevance of 'Transformative Leaders and Role Models' to be created from among the victims and vulnerable to champion their own cause as well as to set strategic paths for their younger generations. This has been one of the high focus intervention areas of the organization from its inception.

Approximately 1250 early and forced marriages were stopped in time as a result of our extensive campaigns and ground level interventions against early and forced marriages.

CHILD LABOUR WELFARE PROGRAMME:

Child Labour has been a priority issue for the organization from the past years. The organization continues to act in the best interest of the children victims or vulnerable to child labour. Labour refers to the practices of having children

engage in economic activity, on a part- or full-time basis. The practice deprives children of their childhood, and is harmful to their physical and mental development. Poverty, lack of good schools and the growth of the informal economy are considered to be the key causes of child labour in India. This program focuses on eradicating child labour from the society.

DISABLED CHILDREN/PARENTS:

Services and welfare of disabled children and their parents have been a special emphasis theme that cross cuts all our interventions. We leverage various programmes and schemes to the benefit of the target group members. Social Welfare Department implement many schemes focusing disabled persons to assist them to secure education, academic, technical or professional training on the shop/floor of the industrial establishment as would enable them to earn a living and to become contributing members of the society. The organization has supported these initiatives by contributing to be a transition vehicle for rolling them out.



LEVERAGING RESOURCES FOR HANDICAPPED SUPPORT:

With the networking relations of the organization, we have been able to leverage and find resources for caregivers and professionals about the unique challenges and service needs of children and youth with disabilities who are involved with the child welfare system, and how to address them.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IRADICATION PROGRAMME:

The organization is committed to ending all forms of Domestic Violence and have been active in this regard from the inception of the organization. Domestic violence is a pattern of behaviour which involves violence or other abuse by one person against another in a domestic setting, such as in marriage or cohabitation. Intimate partner violence is violence by a spouse or partner in an intimate relationship against the other spouse or partner. Domestic violence can take place in heterosexual and same-sex family relationships, and can involve violence against children in the family.



Domestic violence can take a number of forms, including physical, verbal, emotional, economic, religious, and sexual abuse, which can range from subtle, coercive forms to marital rape and to violent physical abuse such as female genital mutilation and acid throwing that results in disfigurement or death. Domestic murders include stoning, bride burning, honour killings, and dowry deaths. With the timely interventions of the organization there have been many instances where persons vulnerable to Domestic Violence have been saved from being silent victims.

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In order to effectively take up cases of marginalized families; 100 advocates were specially trained in four districts and were organized as 'Legal Network'

Approximately 400 cases on Violence Against Women were supported for resolving up to now from the beginning of the programme.

SUPPORT PROGRAMME FOR HIV/AIDS AFFECTED PERSONS:

HIV/AIDS awareness programmes and immediate linkages and necessary services to the contracted persons who gets identified in outreach and counselling sessions is one of the focus areas of the organization. This programme is being carried out by integrating the activity into all the community or family or personal interactions undertaken by any organization staff for any programme. Thus, it is one of the cross-cutting interventions. This program focusses on spreading awareness about HIV/AIDS, how it is spread, how to protect oneself from AIDS and how to treat and behave with the person who is already affected with the HIV/AIDS. Under this program we are connecting the needy persons with centres where the government is providing special care and medical check-ups to the patients. Even when there is no funds earmarked for this programme the interventions continue because of it being integrated to all other programme interventions by the organization.

LITERACY PROGRAM:

Literacy program focus on spreading awareness in the villages about the importance of education. Wherever possible we also initiate and run education centres in the villages to teach the girls and make them stand on their feet. Sarva Siksha Abhiyan is linked under literacy program to make all children literate and eager to study higher.

OLD AGED PERSON WELFARE PROGRAM:

This one of the leverage activities of the organization with the social security schemes of the government. Old aged person welfare program focuses on providing support to the old aged persons of the society. They also become aware about the programs and facilities government has started for better living condition of the old aged persons. The organization supports in getting eligible persons connected with the schemes and also supports in going through the process and procedures.

SUPPORT PROGRAMME ON PULSE POLIO DRIVE:

Along with the interparliamentary and national priorities we are also committed to eradicating polio from our interventions areas. Pulse polio program focus on giving polio drops to the children as well as aware them about the importance and benefits of the polio drops. People also get to know

about the effects of polio virus and till what age children should get polio drops. The organization supports the programme through awareness generation, removal of aspersions and connecting families with infants to this drive.

SANITATION PROGRAM:

The organization considers sanitation as a right of every person and is committed to connect our target area eligible beneficiaries to claim individual, community and family toilets. Sanitation program is a initiative of



government of India to provide toilets in all the houses of India. This program focuses on spreading awareness among the people about the use of toilets, its advantages and safety. People also get to know about the project where government is providing fund to build toilets and sewage system.

Continued follow up and programmes were undertaken on WASH awareness, training and infrastructure development was done in 80 schools and 40 Anganwaris. Blocks and District level government officials, teachers and School Management Committee Members from 19 districts were provided training on WASH.

DALIT & MARGINALIZE COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME:

The organization has prime focus on women undergoing violence and Domestic Violence with focus on minority and dalit since inception, as the status of women in Bihar is degraded and faces series of violence and exploitation at family as well as society. The status of minority and dalit women is further degraded due to deep caste system and class division at social strata. They have secondary status at family as well as community and their labour at house and agriculture are seriously neglected. For effective mobilization and community sensitization the organization mobilizes women youth and women members in convergence with govt. Cycle Yojna, Posak Yojna and make avail education and playing materials to children at schools. We regularly conduct meetings of Talimi Committees. The committees

promoted and strengthened in the past years also engage in follow up on domestic violence, RTE and gender issues. The committee members are also trained on legal framework, procedures for FIR and follow up processes are taken up on regular basis.

From the past years we have strengthened Adolescent Girls Groups in continuous operation. Adolescent girls of age group (11-18) years are organized in Kishori Groups. They are trained on leadership, health & nutrition, legal rights, importance of higher education, ill effects of early marriage etc' The Kishori Groups conducted regular meetings. They are practicing monthly meeting and discussing girls' rights and doing advocacy at higher level. They are also doing advocacy for education related service delivery at schools by govt.

ADOLESCENT EDUCATION AND LIFE-SKILL PROGRAMME:

The organization has prime focus on strengthening minority girls through mainstreaming them with education. In this line the organization has been systematically and strategically implementing



minority adolescent girls focused education program at all the operational areas of the organization. The school dropout and non-grouped children are special focus here. They are sensitized on the issues and subjects of women undergoing violence and domestic violence and are mobilized for community sensitization. The groups sensitize and orient women members in the area through community meetings, focus group discussions and BCC events using effective resource materials. The members gradually become the member of Mahila Dasta Mehfil, who visit different Muhallas, sensitize community, take the issues and forward them to administration, engage in advocacy till district level. These community structures have become effective means to take over the women and domestic violence issues in a sustained manner. The program was implemented in collaboration and networking with various like-minded and collaborator organizations associated with us through past years.

- 180 girls were trained and capacitated as Techno-Leaders in various mohallas of Patna

SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME:

Since inception the Organization is making efforts for empowering women with focus on Minority and Dalit women. In this line the organization has imparted vocational training to women belonging to poorest of the poor including Minority and Dalit women members of various interventions locations of the organization. The major courses offered were in Tailoring and Embroidery, Painting and Food Processing. Along with this the organization put efforts and focuses on leadership development and improving decision making ability of women belonging to underprivileged sections of the society. The training programs have improved the skills of target women members and they are engaged in income generation activities. The organization is ever in lookout for leveraging various programmes and schemes as well as other institutions and organizations for continuing the skill development programme.

EDUCATION PROGRAMME FOR MUSAHAR CHILDREN:

Out of the most marginalized and highly vulnerable to exclusions is the Musahar Community. Musahar children education program focuses on educating the children of families living in Musahar Toli and belonging to Musahar community who do not have enough earnings to send their children to schools. The organization has put up continuous efforts for mainstreaming challenged underprivileged and children from various sections of the society with education. Our programme is focused on mainstreaming non school going and school dropout Musahar children with formal education. It is focused on education promotion, community strengthening, leadership development and developing education habit and convergence of children with govt schools for continued and higher



education. Where ever possible based on the availability of resources we establish learning centres which help to develop education habits among non-schools going and school dropout Mushar children and mainstream them with formal education system. For proper functioning of schools, retention of mainstreamed children, ongoing monitoring and maintaining quality education; we strengthen and mobilize school Management committees, a local level committee mechanism initiated under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan. We also conduct different school level activities such as puppet show, establish Bal Sansad, Meena Manch, debates, drawing competition, public hearing program etc for mobilizing Mushar children who have very less exposure to education. They are included in Bal Sansad and Meena Manch. They are actively participating in meetings and discuss on children's rights, right to education and also are mobilizing the rest of the community children. It has resulted in positive impact in the community and parents are also mobilized. As a result, now they have begun to prefer children's education rather than engaging them in work. The children also celebrate Shiksha Samman Divas, where children, parents, PRI members, school teachers etc. participate. We conduct orientation and training on Right to education and Khel se Mel, which has helped in improved awareness levels of participants, and developed need based, and culturally viable Teaching and Learning materials on language, Maths and science teaching kits and IEC materials. Further, we also conduct training on pedagogy development for improving the quality of education. The program also makes efforts to strengthen the Tola Sewaks through orientation programs and training events. In order to bring sustainability to this programme the organization has adopted this programme into one of the core programme initiatives of the organization and gives priority for raising funds for the continued operation of this programme.

Running the boys children's home :

The organization continued its collaborated with State Government of Bihar in operating Children's Home of Bihar State Child Protection Society (SCPS Bihar) where 30 children for every year were sheltered and 20 were re-united with their families during 2020-21.
